



## Annual Report, 2009

### ***Our Dear Partners!***

May I take this opportunity to thank you wholly for the achievements that Msamaria Centre has gone through your moral, material and financial support, Msamaria centre is now two years old through you we have realized many goals and aims which we had planned to undertake 2009.

### Achievements

The center so far has witnessed a lot of achievement since it has started 2007 that was:

- **Children increased**

The center had registered 11 kids when it opened and this number has increased tremendously from 11 kids to 112 children who were served in different time among them some had dropped, referred to other centers, unified into their families/fostering, adopted and the remaining 64, however from this total two are home stays and the other two placed in boarding schools.

- **Staff**

#### **Local**

The staff has reduced from 12 to the currently 8.

This has been done for improving the quality of service delivering to Msamaria kids by expelling non-professionals and those who had no compassion with children.

#### **Foreigner volunteers**

In 2009 the center has managed to attract and accommodate foreign volunteers from different countries Germany was taking led followed by USA, but most of these volunteers are short term, however Msamaria does not host these volunteers it collaborates with several companies to mentioned the few were Tanzania Cross Cultural Solution, World Unity, Foot 2 Africa, Tanzania Volunteer, Volunteer Solution, Tanzania Volunteer Project, Hostel Hoff and First Aid Africa.

- **Food and Health**

The center is being providing four meals a day i.e. Pollige at 7am, Tea and bread at 10am and lunch and dinner, what children have to take for day depends on food schedule but the common once are Rice and Beans which is accompanied with fruits.

The center has big compound and good sanitation this minimizes the risk of getting diseases.

Mama Machua in the other name Mama Msamaria, she worked hard in maintain health of our children. Likewise to 2008 Malaria, Cough and wounds it was reported mostly.

### Education

- **Non-Formal Classes**

The non-formal classes were improved as many children went to school in the beginning of January, the average number in a class remain 10 as the result class concentration were improved and teaching went more smoothly as each kids had a table and chair.

### Formal Classes

The center in collaboration with our stakeholders had managed to re-unity two groups of children in formal Government schools; in January 2009 a first group of 40 children went to school, again in July another 12 children join for formal school, and however, the other two children join vocational training specialized in Motor Mechanics.

- **New Website**

The Board of Msamaria in its emergency meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> November,2009 decided to have a new website following the poor relationship with the one who was hosting it, the special thanks should go to Amanda Watts, the former Msamaria volunteer from Canada for her volunteering time in constructing it and sponsor.

- **Fundraing/Marketing**

Despite little has made in fundraising but a big effort had just employed to attract both local and foreign donations in order to make organization survive. The manage med kept on learning from other successful organizations what strategies up lifted them to be where they are a well as maintaining such status. Projects write ups had written and submitted in and out of the country, a thousands of book marks and fliers were created and posted in different parts of Moshi especially in the Hotels, Coffee shops, Universities and colleges, Internet Café etc.

## **CHALLENGES**

- **Children's food**

Providing food to children is one of the main challenge since the organization has no permanent donor and the experience has shown that despite of its importance still very few donors had willing to support children's food as this sometimes forced the management to reallocate donors funds in order to make organization alive hence brings an image of mistrust to most of our donors.

- **Rent for Children shelter**

Despite of the significant development still the center rent its existing premises and therefore we subjected to pay yearly.

- **Staff assistance**

Unlikely last year the center has not been able to pay staff salaries/wages to existing staff as results some of the professional staff go to look for good paid jobs and as this it makes life very hard to remaining staffs bearing in mind that most of them have families who needs food, school fees ,house rent etc.

- **Inadequate Office Equipments Support**

The center needs internet services, computers facilities, printers, photocopy machines, scanners, projector, TV etc in order to reduce management cost.

- **Non-formal School System**

The non- formal programme is geared to prepare children for formal school and the secondly, for behavioral modification. For effective implementation the program need textbooks, Exercise books and other school supplies.

- **Formal Students**

The 59 children's who are formal education programs demands many requirements ranges from school fees and contributions, uniforms, education supplies and other necessities for facilitating their learning, while no donor is committed for 100% in helping them.

Apart from that a group of 10 children who planned to join school in the begging of January some of their cost are not yet being covered.

- **Unfunded Project**

Despite off the greater efforts made by the management to acquire donors support for proposed projects over the last year still it witnessed other projects has never been funded as this brought a lot of challenges to volunteers, staffs as well as our beneficiaries interested those areas, to mention few example were Home visits, Outreach programs and Family Rafiki. To overcome the situation the Board had decided to hire consultancy in meeting the challenging demand, therefore your cooperation highly recommended.

## Income Generating Project

Over the last year the Board and management of Msamaria come up an idea of creating income generating projects in order to have a sustainable source of funds as the fail to get permanent donors while children's demanding daily assistance, however these might develop self reliance education to children. But very little success has been achieved so far; the proposed projects are as follows;

- Chicken breeding facility
- Cattle diary
- Crop production
- Bio-gas cooking system
- Selling to tourist products made by children like bracelets & reckless , seasonal cards, tie and dye, batik etc
- Selling t-shirts to tourists who regular visits the center
- Empower traditional dance and acrobatic group to perform in tourist hotels, hostels etc
